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

FROM THE DIRECTOR



The Mousetrap is a play that is on one hand like all plays from the mid-20th Century and on the other hand stands very much alone. It is classic in its cast size, structure, and sensibilities. But looking at the play 70 years after its premiere, *The Mousetrap* still resonates for audiences unlike many of its contemporaries. *The Mousetrap* doesn't work because it is a perfect play–although it is pretty

good. It doesn't intrigue because it's revolutionary for twists and turns-it isn't. *The Mousetrap* resonates because it's about how people handle their pasts....and that is something that hasn't changed.

Memory is an interesting thing. It can seem sharp and focused. It can be fuzzy or vague. Rarely, if ever, will it be "the truth." We remember what is important to us-that is why you might remember a present you got when you were 3, but remember what you ate for lunch yesterday. We misremember events how we wished things had happened-that is why two people can have memories of the same event that do not match. We forget those things that are difficult to deal with. We lock away traumatic memories. We close ourselves off to memories that cause pain. It is this world of "our memory can lie to us" in which The Mousetrap exists.

As a cast and crew, we hope that you will remember this experience as something important....and tell others they should experience it as well. But please, let that memory lie and not reveal the secrets you are about to uncover.
